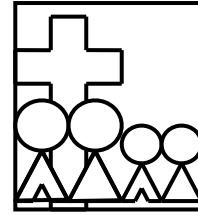
Please Note: There will be no service here on Sunday 12 May as we are joining with our friends at Woodstock and the service will start at **10.30am**.
